Congratulations to the seven students who recently graduated from the skills exchange program run at AB Central in Airds between April and June 2021. The program is designed to place local residents in local jobs.

Participants successfully underwent training for a Certificate II in Construction Pathways while also being provided mentoring, life skills training, assistance with obtaining a drivers licence and support from our partner Empowering Growth.

The Certificate II is a nationally recognised qualification within the building industry, and students will continue to receive support for another 12 months to help them apply their new skills and find jobs. One student will also get an opportunity to take a job placement with WEM, who is the civil contractor for Airds.

The tournament was initiated after consultation with Aboriginal communities across NSW. It provides opportunities for players, their families and communities to discuss their cultural identity.

Connecting with our kids about mental health

In May 2021, more than 2,800 local primary school children learned important lessons about mental health and the power of positive thinking.

The Mind Masters program was run at eight primary schools in and around Campbelltown, including Lomandra School and Kentlyn Public School.

The program included learning about mental health, positive thinking, mindfulness, resilience and dealing with stress.

One teacher at Blairmount Public School said it was an excellent program that students enjoyed and could understand.

Development applications for subdivision works across four small sites within Airds were lodged with Campbelltown City Council earlier this year.

Cottage sales

Construction update

Stage 6

Construction works for Stage 6 are continuing, with Stage 6A to deliver 59 lots and Stage 6B to deliver 89 lots.

- Stage 6A works are nearing completion with footpath works underway. Registration is anticipated in July 2021.
- Stage 6B subdivision works are progressing well and are expected to be finished by early 2022.

Stage 4

Construction works for Stage 4 are continuing and will deliver around 138 private lots and land for up to 49 social homes, including new housing for seniors and Aboriginal housing. Due to wet weather and delays in the planning process, these works are

now anticipated to be finished in early 2022.

Stage 5, 7, 8 and 9

Planning is well underway for Stages 5, 7, 8 and 9. Development applications for Stages 7, 8 and 9 have been submitted to Campbelltown City Council. The development application for Stage 5 is anticipated to be lodged before the end of August 2021.

Upcoming works

Kevin Wheatley playing fields

Construction approval has not yet been received for works to start on the new Kevin Wheatley playing fields. However, earthworks are anticipated to commence towards the end of the year.

The Ponds

Earthworks for The Ponds are anticipated to commence in November this year. These earthworks will take about six months to complete and will be followed by landscaping and construction of viewing decks which will provide places for you to relax and enjoy views over the water.

Road closures

Briar Road works

The final stages of works to install the new trunk watermains in Briar Road are complete and the road is now open. Thank you for your patience and cooperation during these works.

Campbellfield Avenue extension

Works to extend Campbellfield Avenue are continuing, with works currently underway on the western end of St Johns Road and Creigan Road. It is anticipated that works will be completed in October 2021. Construction works for the eastern end are currently under assessment with Council and are expected to commence in September 2021. The extension

of Campbellfield Avenue is anticipated to open in early 2022.

Riverside Drive closure

As part of the Stage 4 works, Riverside Drive is being realigned to form an easier route to Wheatley Drive. During the works, an alternative route will be available to access Riverside Drive East and Deans Road.

The following temporary road closures are in place:

- Riverside Drive is currently closed between Deans Road and Wheatley Drive
- access to Riverside Drive from Deans Road is closed with access only provided to local residents
- access to Riverside Drive from Nandewar Place is closed with access only provided to local residents.

The roads are expected to be closed until early August 2021.

Riverside Drive will be closed between Wheatley Drive and Towner Avenue from October 2021 until January 2022.
