### Housing construction and sales

Construction works for Stages 1, 2, 3A and 3B are complete, while construction of Stage 11 commenced in December 2022. Further site investigations for Stage 4 are under way before we commence remediation works and construction in the second half of 2023. A development application has been lodged with Council for upgrades to Davis Park, including a new children's playground.

New 'fit for purpose' social housing is being delivered at Claymore to better meet future resident needs, with 27 new detached homes recently delivered as part of Stage 3. The design of new seniors living units is also underway in Stages 3C and 4.

The latest release of lots for sale was held on 18 February 2023.

Closing out 2022 on a high note, LAHC roused the community's festive spirits by holding an end-of-year celebration. Around 300 locals attended this event and enjoyed a joyful day packed with music, food, rides and roving performers.

The National Theatre for Children performed part of their Mind Masters program for Claymore Public School before Term 1 wrapped up.



Rehousing and demolition activities are being undertaken by the NSW Department of Communities and Justice. Stage 11 residential relocations are complete. Rehousing in the Stage 9A redevelopment area commenced in early August 2022.




# Tackling illegal activities
