Housing construction and sales

Construction works for Stages 1, 2, 3A and 3B are complete, while construction of Stage 11 commenced in December. Further site investigations for Stage 4 are anticipated to commence in February 2023 before we commence construction.

New 'fit for purpose' social housing is also being delivered at Claymore to better meet future resident needs, with 27 homes being delivered in Stage 3. The design of new seniors living units is also underway in Stages 3C and 4.

The latest release of lots for sale was held on 19 November 2022.

2022 career expo a success

LAHC's annual careers expo for students at Airds High School and Eagle Vale High School was a big success, with 44 stallholders providing insight into careers across industries as diverse as business, trades and healthcare.

245 students from grades 10 to 12, as well as 30 community members, attended the expo in early September to hear from different speakers and chat with industry and business representatives about career opportunities that spark their interest.




Tackling illegal activities



Looking for a job or want to improve your current job situation? If you are a social housing client, sign up to the Empowering Growth Job Club. You'll be supported by a learning and employment facilitator to create a training and employment plan which maps out your goals and training opportunities that will help you to gain new qualifications and employment.

Practical support you could access through the program includes financial assistance to pay for a licence, work tools or transport, or you may make use of workshops and mentoring opportunities to build your confidence in writing resumes and attending job interviews.

You may be able to participate in the Job Club if you are:

- aged 17 years and over
- living in public, community or Aboriginal housing
- an approved social housing applicant on the NSW Housing Register
- willing and ready to get a job and participate in a training plan.
