At the end of this project, Landcom wants to know North Wilton is a very livable, and deeply loveable, place to live. And to make sure this happens we're looking to work with the community to develop a shared vision to guide important planning and design decisions throughout the lifetime of the project.

- 1. What were your first impressions of North Wilton?

What's happening \leftarrow

Over the next 25 years, Landcom will develop up to 514ha of the North Wilton site, with space to create 5,600 new homes. Landcom is planning North Wilton gradually and carefully, and right now we're reaching out to the Wollondilly community to help us lay the groundwork for a strong community.

In the next few months look out for:

- visioning workshops, where the community will help us shape the shared project vision for North Wilton (coming very soon! See dates and times in this newsletter)
- anticipated approval of the Stage 1 Development **Application**
- enabling earthworks for the extension of Fairway Drive under the existing Development Consent
- start of construction on Stage 1 (subject to Council approval).
